- o This dual-site pilot study seeks to evaluate the effectiveness of a novel short-term intervention founded in sensory and pre-linguistic communication components and delivered in a parent-coaching model to infants and toddlers identified through a community-based screen. Primary and secondary outcomes include parent-child engagement, child receptive and expressive language, child sensory processing, child and parent respiratory sinus arrhythmia, child skin-conductance levels, and parent responsiveness. The study uses a crossover design with pre- and post-assessments and two follow-up assessments. Comparison groups of high-risk and low-risk toddlers follow the same assessment schedule.

- O I began as assessment coordinator and transitioned to the project coordinator role after one year. In the project coordinator position, I oversaw all recruitment, assessment, and intervention activities, including budget, assessment scheduling, communication with participants, management of physiological technology (RSA, SCL, eye-tracking), IRB protocols, data management, contributions to statistical analyses, and funding updates to NIH. I coordinated a team of 8 undergraduate research assistants, 8 Master's level research assistants, 13 doctoral students, 3 post-doctoral fellows, 4 faculty, and 2 PIs.

 - This randomized controlled trial evaluated the effectiveness of a parent-mediated intervention, *Adapted Responsive Teaching*, among a group of infants at-risk for autism according to a community-based screen.
 Intervention lasted for 6-8 months, with pre- and post-assessments and a follow-up assessment at preschool-age.
 - I began administering follow-up assessments at the preschool-age timepoint, coordinating data entry, and video-coding parent-child interactions. I then transitioned to project coordinator after two years, managing data and IRB protocols, and contributing to statistical analyses.
