It is physically organized around the Academical Village, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and includes twelve schools and an academic medical center. With total enrollment of 25,000, faculty of 3,300, and staff of 6,700, the University is currently ranked #4 Best Public National University by US News & World Report (2021), #2 Best Value Public University by Money Magazine (2020), and #1 Hospital in Virginia by US News & World Report (2021).

The Princeton Review recently ranked Darden professors #1, for the fourth year in a row, and #2 for best classroom experience. The Senior Associate Dean and Chief Operating Officer role included direct responsibility for a similar set of academic and administrative activities in both the School and the Foundation.
