TRANSFER GUIDANCE

Competitive Applicants for UVA's School of Education and Human Development:

By meeting the following criteria, you position yourself as a competitive applicant.

- Meet all or nearly all of the program's general education requirements.
- Earn a minimum GPA of 3.0 or better at your current institution.
- Have 54-60 transferable credits.
- Have prior experience working with youth (experience can be within or outside of schools).

All UVA Teacher Education transfer students begin in the fall semester. There is no spring start term.

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING COURSES?

- Create a schedule for all required courses, paying attention to prerequisites and when courses are offered. Complete your first mathematics and English courses in your first year.

- Are you passionate about learning and imparting knowledge?
- Do you want to be an educator of children?
- Do you enjoy collaborating and working in an educational environment?
- This program leads to a Bachelor of Science in Education degree and a Virginia teaching license. Students will be eligible to teach upon completion of all degree and licensure requirements.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT ON MY DEGREE OF WORK I HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED?

- **Associate Transfer Degree Completion:** Puts you on track to graduate within 4 semesters after transferring.
- **Credit for Prior Learning:** AP and IB test scores are evaluated for credit.
- **Catalog Year:** Catalog year determined by first semester of attendance at the community college post-high school graduation.

IS THIS SCHOOL RIGHT FOR ME?

- Located in Charlottesville, VA, this is a full-time residential program. Students must be available for classes and field experiences during the day, and some evening classes are required.
- UVA's School of Education and Human Development provides the feeling of a smaller school while offering the benefits of being part of a large university.
- Teacher Education faculty are equity-oriented teacher educators, collaborators, and innovators.

DID YOU KNOW THAT...

- Students must apply to transfer to UVA by their second year, or the equivalent of four full-time semesters.
- A maximum of 60 credits from other institutions of higher education can be transferred to UVA.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS DEGREE?

Most Teacher Education graduates go on to teach. Graduates also pursue careers in non-traditional education settings, non-profit organizations, and local and state educational agencies.

PROGRAM SUCCESSES & HIGHLIGHTS

- More than 95% of program graduates applying to teaching positions are hired.
- Many UVA Teacher Education graduates go on to be teacher leaders in the field.

WHAT ARE MY CHANCES FOR GETTING ACCEPTED?

- UVA tends to admit 35-40% of transfer applicants who apply to start at UVA in the fall.
- The Teacher Education program is committed to accepting as many qualified applicants as they are able to support with high-quality advising and field placements.

DO MORE WITH YOUR DEGREE!

- This degree prepares students to apply to a range of graduate education programs if they wish to further their professional knowledge and skills. Graduates with a 3.3 GPA are eligible for guaranteed admission into several UVA graduate education programs.

OTHER THAN CLASSES, ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS?

- Students will complete a minimum of four clinical experiences in different schools across the Charlottesville region.
- Students must complete required exams and trainings to meet state licensing requirements
