Frameworks Conceptualizing Youth and Adult Engagement

Framework Option 1

Stepping back from 'The ladder': Reflections on a model of participatory work with children

(Hart, 2008)

8 levels of youth participation:

Non-participation

- 1. Manipulation
- 2. Decoration
- 3. Tokenism

Degrees of participation

- 4. Assigned but informed
- 5. Consulted and informed
- 6. Adult-initiated, shared decisions with children
- 7. Youth-initiated and directed

Youth-initiated, shared decisions with adults

Framework Option 2

Pyramid of student voice:

- 'Being heard'
 - Bottom level of the pyramid
 - Most common and most basic form of youth voice (e.g., school personnel listen to youth about their experiences in their school)
- 'Collaborating with adults'
 - Middle level of the pyramid
 - Youth work with adults to make changes in the environment (e.g., collecting data on school problems and implementing solutions)
- 'Building capacity for leadership'
 - Top level of the pyramid

Explicit focus on enabling youth to share in the leadership of the youth voice initiative

Increasing student voice in high school reform: Building partnerships, improving outcomes

Framework Option 3

Matrix framework to visualize youth participation in evaluation:

- Youth as Consultants (most common)
 - Youth share opinions with adults
- Youth as Collaborators
 - Youth engaged in parts, but not all of evaluation
- Youth as Partners
 - Youth work alongside adults in development and implementation of evaluation, with attempts to create equal power
- Youth as Leaders
 - Young people lead an evaluation themselves and adults serve as coaches or critical friends
