# Faculty PhD Mentorship Review Process December 13, 2018

# **New Reviews**

1. New faculty on a renewable term that is 3 years or less

All faculty who are new to Curry in a given academic year who work with PhD students will be granted co-mentor status until the end of their first renewable term. This includes pre-tenure faculty, research faculty, and general faculty. The PhD Studies committee will review annual report data for these faculty with a sole focus on the mentoring and scholarship sections to make mentorship decisions. This review process will occur when pre-tenure faculty, research faculty, and general faculty go through the mid-tenure review process.

When a faculty member achieves mentorship status, if they have been co-mentoring a PhD student, co-mentorship will continue until the student graduates.

2. New hires who (a) are pre-tenure and (b) will not have a mid-tenure review

All new faculty who meet the criteria for (a) and (b) and who work with PhD students will be granted co-mentor status until they nominate themselves for mentorship status or are nominated by their department chair. They can nominate themselves by checking the relevant box on the Faculty Annual Report. The PhD Studies committee will review annual report data for these faculty with a sole focus on the mentoring and scholarship sections to make mentorship decisions.

When a faculty member achieves mentorship status, if they have been co-mentoring a PhD student, co-mentorship will continue until the student graduates.

3. New hires who are post-tenure regardless of rank; i.e., those who are hired without term

# **Continuing Reviews**

PhD mentorship status term for any Curry faculty member lasts for 6 years. After the six-year term is completed, the PhD Studies committee will review the prior 3 years of annual report data to make a decision regarding continued mentorship status.
